**Purpose:** To communicate the key components of the CMHAMM decision making process and the roles played by participants in the process.

**Announcement:** The CMHAMM Advisory and Decision Making Guideline (revised on 02/10/2009) highlights the key components of the CMHAMM's decision making process as it relates to the development, issuance, implementation, monitoring, and enforcement of, CMHAMM policies and procedures. This guideline was developed with input from CMHAMM committees and councils responsible for the oversight of affiliation activities. It will be reviewed by the PIHP's Executive Director on an annual basis (minimally) and recommended revisions will be considered by the Executive Director during an announced review period. If appropriate, as determined by the Executive Director, the DAO will formally rescind the previous version of the guideline and issue a revised version, based on affiliate recommendations and/or contractual obligations between the PIHP and MDCH or the PIHP and affiliate members.

The PIHP will only consider as valid, revisions to this guideline that have been communicated to affiliates via signed CMHAMM bulletin from the DAO.

This guideline will remain in effect until the DAO formally communicates a change in its status.
