Topics Discussed	Discussion/Decisions	Action/Responsible Party
Kevin's Law	Jail Diversion only relates to criminal law, not civil – Kevin's Law is civil and in the Mental Health Code. Wasn't designed as JD tool, was designed to assist people who cannot get services.	
Data Systems	Local Health Foundations (put up money to gather data to benefit the community) Pre and Post Doctoral candidates do research for class credit, work for free and develop the system.	
Needs:	Separate number of re-arrests due to probation violations and new charges Linkage = divert AND case manage. Just diverting causes recidivism. Case Management needs to be part of Jail Diversion. 12 Elements on the screening form need to be added to our data system, cost of creating screens and reports. Determine what we will track, what we will do with it and deadlines.
