Summary of Outcomes: (this information will be based on tasks/outcomes given to the group)

The PIHP is responsible for monitoring the CMHSP's in the following areas:

1. Each CMHSP has an interagency agreement that describes the specific pathways of the pre-booking and post-booking jail diversion program w/ law enforcement entity on their service area.
2. Each CMHSP has a post-booking jail diversion program in place that ensures jail detainees are screened for the presence of a serious mental illness, co-occurring substance abuse disorder, or developmental disability within the first 24-48 hours of detention.
3. Each CMHSP assigns specific staff to the pre-booking and post-booking program to serve as liaison between the mental health, substance abuse, and criminal justice systems.
4. Each CMHSP establishes regular meetings among the police/sheriffs, court personnel, prosecuting attorney, judges, and CMHSP representatives.
5. Each CMHSP provides cross training for law enforcement and mental health personnel on the pre-booking and post-booking jail diversion program.
6. Each CMHSP maintains a management information system that can identify individuals brought or referred to the mental health agency as a result of a pre-booking or post-booking diversion.

Outstanding Tasks/Outcomes not yet completed:

1. Each CMHSP is responsible for submitting pre-booking and post-booking data to the PIHP (quarterly) and MDCH (annually).
2. For the past two years the PIHP has facilitated a Jail Diversion meeting, comprised of CMHSP Jail Diversion personnel, to discuss compliance w/ the above identified items as well as any other issues that the group feels beneficial to discuss in regards to jail diversion.

Barriers to completing Tasks/Outcomes:

Currently there is no clear direction on what should be done with the data, once it has been collected, in order to make quality improvements. High or low numbers are not necessarily an indication of the effectiveness of any particular program.
