Summary of Outcomes: (this information will be based on tasks/outcomes given to the group)

NCMH currently has one (1) clinician from the youth services unit trained in the Wraparound Process. During the past 12 months, a total of 20 families have been involved with the Wraparound Process. Of those 20 families, seven(7) families successfully met their goals and demonstrated a decrease in the CAFAS scores; four (4) families did not complete the Wraparound Process, i.e., the child was placed out of the home, failure to keep related appointments, moved out of the county, etc. Of the 20 families, nine (9) are currently active in the Wraparound process as of this reporting date (4/09/10).

Per Mike Hetzman of Gratiot CMH, currently Gratiot County does not have any families enrolled in their Wraparound Process nor do they have an active Community and Family Team since the end of the last fiscal year (9/30/09). Prior to that time, Wraparound was funded primarily by a three party agreement between Gratiot County Court, DHS and Gratiot CMH. The Wraparound coordination was provided via a contract with Lutheran Child and Family Services out of Grand Rapids. As of 10/01/09 the Gratiot County Court chose to re-allocate resources to a different in-home program that focused on parenting skills and there were not sufficient funds for Gratiot CMH to cover the subsequent short fall in funding. During that same time frame, Gratiot CMH has sent representative staff from their Children's services unit to MDCH Wraparound training with the intent of providing that coordination of services, however, recent correspondence with the former members of the Community Team has indicated that there is a lack of interest on their part in both the reconvening of the Team or making referrals for the Wraparound process.

As of the date of writing this report (4/09/10) I have not received any updates from any other affiliates, specifically Manistee-Benzie and CEI.

Outstanding Tasks/Outcomes not yet completed:

Restoration of the Wraparound Process/Community Team to Gratiot County.

Barriers to completing Tasks/Outcomes:

Per NCMH, possible barriers are access to the Wraparound Process by SED children who meet the criteria but do not have Medicaid.

Per Gratiot CMH, re-engaging the Community/Family Team and seeking referrals.
